Double Track NWI: Connectivity for Accelerated Growth

The South Shore Line is undertaking an exciting new project that is certain to benefit our regional communities: the Double Track Northwest Indiana (NWI) project. Currently, the train operates on a single track between Gary and Michigan City. With Double Track NWI, a second track will be installed to reduce travel time and improve reliability. The South Shore Line will also improve five station platforms and increase safety by separating the tracks that are in the street in Michigan City from the roadway.

The project is intended to have several benefits for both South Shore Line passengers and the region:

- · Significantly reduced travel time
- More trains and improved reliability
- Platform-level boarding for improved accessibility at select stations
- Station upgrades that spark private investment in the area
- Enhanced safety in Michigan City and throughout the system

The Double Track NWI project is a complex effort requiring extensive planning, engineering, environmental analysis, and negotiations with numerous stakeholders. This is just the beginning of a multi-year process, and we truly value your involvement.
